Moment in the Word: Rev. 21:5-7

Rev. 21:5. And he who was seated on the throne said, "Behold, I am making all things new." Also he said, "Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true."

Rev. 21:6. And he said to me, "It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. To the thirsty I will give from the spring of the water of life without payment."

The Ten Commandments

You shall have no other gods before me.

You shall not make for yourself a carved image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. You shall not bow down to them or serve them,

You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain, for the LORD will not hold him guiltless who takes his name in vain.

Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy.

Honor your father and your mother, that your days may be long in the land that the LORD your God is giving you.

Heidelberg Catechism, Lord's Day 4

[Pastor:] Is God, then, not unjust by requiring in His law what man cannot do?

[All:] No, for God so created man that he was able to do it. But man, at the instigation of the devil, in deliberate disobedience robbed himself and all his descendants of these gifts.

[Pastor:] Will God allow such disobedience and apostasy to go unpunished?

[All:] Certainly not. He is terribly displeased with our original sin as well as our actual sins. Therefore He will punish them by a just judgment both now and eternally, as He has declared: Cursed be every one who does not abide by all things written in the book of the law, and do them.

[Pastor:] But is God not also merciful?

[All:] God is indeed merciful, but He is also just. His justice requires that sin committed against the most high majesty of God also be punished with the most severe, that is, with everlasting, punishment of body and soul.

Scripture Reading: John 19:28–30

John 19:28. After this, Jesus, knowing that all was now finished, said (to fulfill the Scripture), "I thirst."

John 19:29. A jar full of sour wine stood there, so they put a sponge full of the sour wine on a hyssop branch and held it to his mouth.

John 19:30. When Jesus had received the sour wine, he said, "It is finished," and he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.
