2Sam. 9:6. And Mephibosheth the son of Jonathan, son of Saul, came to David and fell on his face and paid homage. And David said, "Mephibosheth!" And he answered, "Behold, I am your servant."

2Sam. 9:7. And David said to him, "Do not fear, for I will show you kindness for the sake of your father Jonathan, and I will restore to you all the land of Saul your father, and you shall eat at my table always."

2Sam. 9:8. And he paid homage and said, "What is your servant, that you should show regard for a dead dog such as I?"

2Sam. 9:13. So Mephibosheth lived in Jerusalem, for he ate always at the king's table. Now he was lame in both his feet.

The Ten Commandments

Heidelberg Catechism, Lord's Day 13
