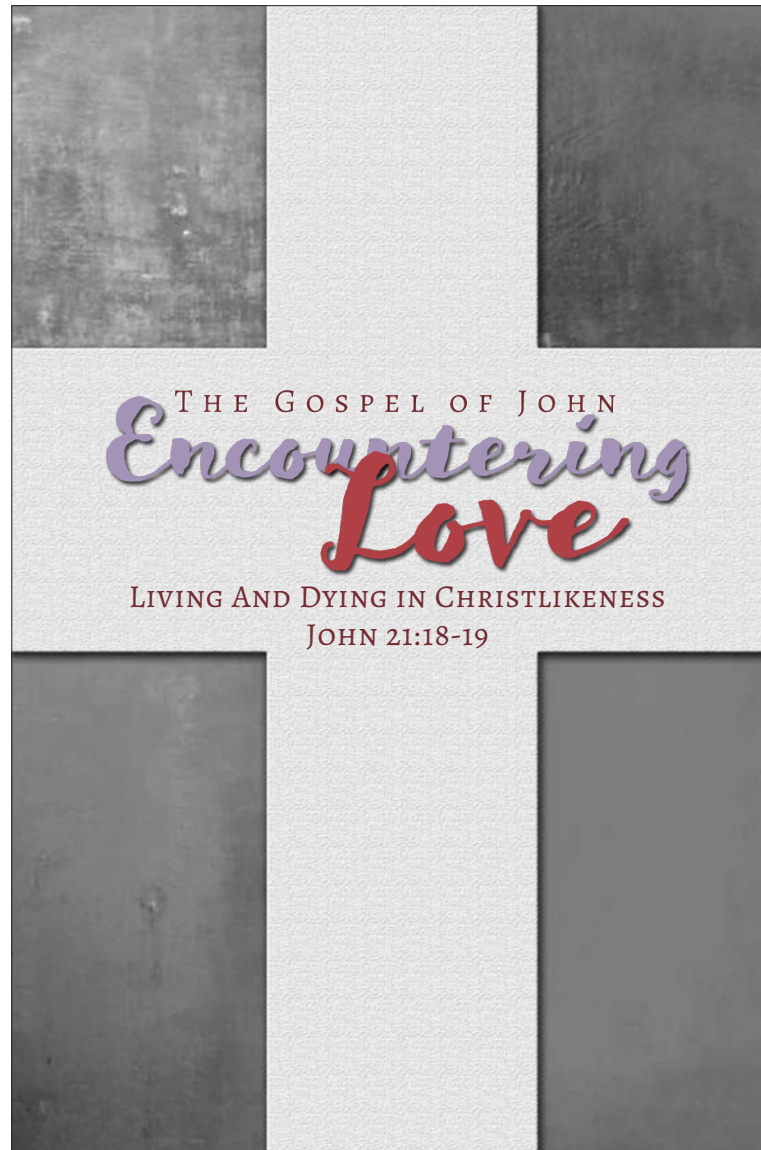

Moment in the Word: Rom. 8:35–39

Rom. 8:35. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword?

Rom. 8:36. As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered."

Rom. 8:37. No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us.

Rom. 8:38. For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers,

Rom. 8:39. nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Scripture Reading: Heb. 11:32–12:3

[Pastor:] And what more shall I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets— (Heb. 11:32)

[Congregation:] who through faith conquered kingdoms, enforced justice, obtained promises, stopped the mouths of lions, (Heb. 11:33)

[Pastor:] quenched the power of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, were made strong out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. (Heb. 11:34)

[Congregation:] Women received back their dead by resurrection. Some were tortured, refusing to accept release, so that they might rise again to a better life. (Heb. 11:35)

[Pastor:] Others suffered mocking and flogging, and even chains and imprisonment. (Heb. 11:36)

[Congregation:] They were stoned, they were sawn in two, they were killed with the sword. They went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, afflicted, mistreated— (Heb. 11:37)

[Pastor:] of whom the world was not worthy— wandering about in deserts and mountains, and in dens and caves of the earth. (Heb. 11:38)

[Congregation:] And all these, though commended through their faith, did not receive what was promised, (Heb. 11:39)

[Pastor:] since God had provided something better for us, that apart from us they should not be made perfect. (Heb. 11:40)

[Congregation:] Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, (Heb. 12:1)

[Pastor:] looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God. (Heb. 12:2)

[All:] Consider him who endured from sinners such hostility against himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted. (Heb. 12:3)

Heidelberg Catechism: Lord's day 15

[Pastor:] What do you understand by the word "suffered"?

[All:] That during his whole life on earth, and especially at the end, Christ sustained in body and soul the wrath of God against the sin of the whole human race. This he did in order that, by his suffering as the only atoning sacrifice, he might redeem us, body and soul, from eternal condemnation, and gain for us God's grace, righteousness, and eternal life.

[Pastor:] Why did he suffer "under Pontius Pilate" as judge?

[All:] So that he, though innocent, might be condemned by an earthly judge, and so set us free from the severe judgment of God that was to fall on us.

[Pastor:] Is there something more in his having been crucified than if he had died some other death?

[All:] Yes, for by this I am assured that he took upon himself the curse which lay upon me, because the death of the cross was cursed by God.

The Narrow Gate Scripture Reading: Lev. 10:1-3

Lev. 10:1. Now Nadab and Abihu, the sons of Aaron, each took his censer and put fire in it and laid incense on it and offered unauthorized fire before the Lord, which he had not commanded them.

Lev. 10:2. And fire came out from before the Lord and consumed them, and they died before the Lord.

Lev. 10:3. Then Moses said to Aaron, "This is what the Lord has said, 'Among those who are near me I will be sanctified, and before all the people I will be glorified.'" And Aaron held his peace.

Scripture Reading: John 21:18-19

John 21:18. Truly, truly, I say to you, when you were young, you used to dress yourself and walk wherever you wanted, but when you are old, you will stretch out your hands, and another will dress you and carry you where you do not want to go."

John 21:19. (This he said to show by what kind of death he was to glorify God.) And after saying this he said to him, "Follow me."
