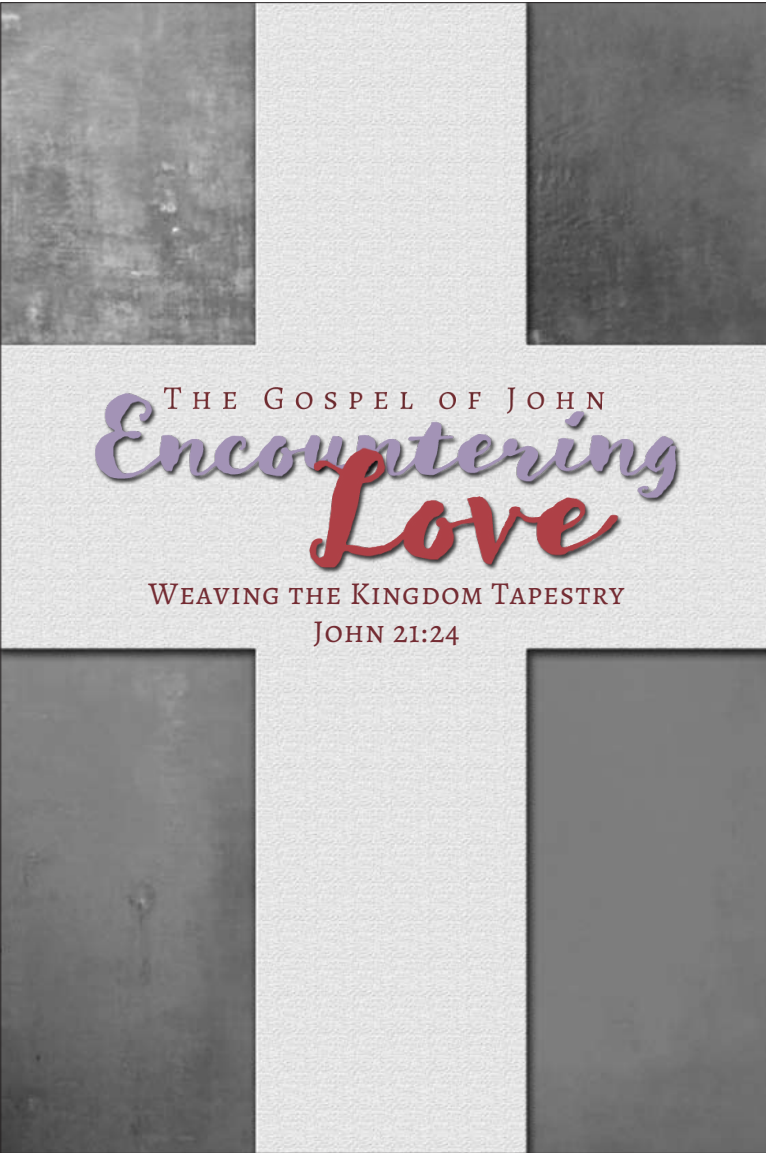

Responsive Scripture Reading: 1Pet. 2:4–10

[Pastor:] As you come to him, a living stone rejected by men but in the sight of God chosen and precious, (1Pet. 2:4)

[Congregation:] you yourselves like living stones are being built up as a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. (1Pet. 2:5)

[Pastor:] For it stands in Scripture: “Behold, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious, and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame.” (1Pet. 2:6)

[Congregation:] So, the honor is for you who believe, but for those who do not believe, “The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone,” (1Pet. 2:7)

[All:] Once you were not a people, but now you are God’s people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy. (1Pet. 2:10)

Heidelberg Catechism: Lord’s day 18

[Pastor:] What do you mean by saying, “He ascended to heaven”?

[All:] That Christ was taken up from the earth into heaven before the very eyes of his disciples and remains there on our behalf until he comes again to judge the living and the dead.

[Pastor:] But isn’t Christ with us until the end of the world as he promised us?

[All:] Christ is truly human and truly god. In his human nature Christ is not now on earth; but in his divinity, majesty, grace, and Spirit he is never absent from us.

[Pastor:] If his humanity is not present wherever his divinity is, then aren’t the two natures of Christ separated from each other?

[All:] Certainly not. Since divinity is incomprehensible and everywhere present, it must follow that the divinity is indeed beyond the bounds of the humanity which it has taken on, and is nonetheless ever in that humanity as well, and remains personally united to it.

[Pastor:] How does Christ’s ascension to heaven benefit us?

[All:] First, he is our advocate in heaven in the presence of his Father. Second, we have our flesh as a full guarantee in heaven that Christ our head, will also take us, his members up to himself. Third, he sends us, as a guarantee on earth, his Spirit by whose power we seek what is above, where Christ is, sitting at the right hand of God, and not things that are on earth.
