

Heidelberg Catechism: Lord's day 36

[Pastor:] What is God's will for us in the third commandment?

[All:] That we neither blaspheme nor misuse the name of God by cursing, perjury, or unnecessary oaths, nor share in such horrible sins by being silent bystanders. In a word, it requires that we use the holy name of God only with reverence and awe, so that we may properly confess God, pray to God, and glorify God in all our words and works.

[Pastor:] Is blasphemy of God's holy name by swearing and cursing really such serious sin that God is angry also with those who do not do all they can to help prevent and forbid it?

[All:] Yes, indeed; for no sin is greater or provokes God's wrath more then the profaning of the divine name. That is why God commanded it to be punished with death.
