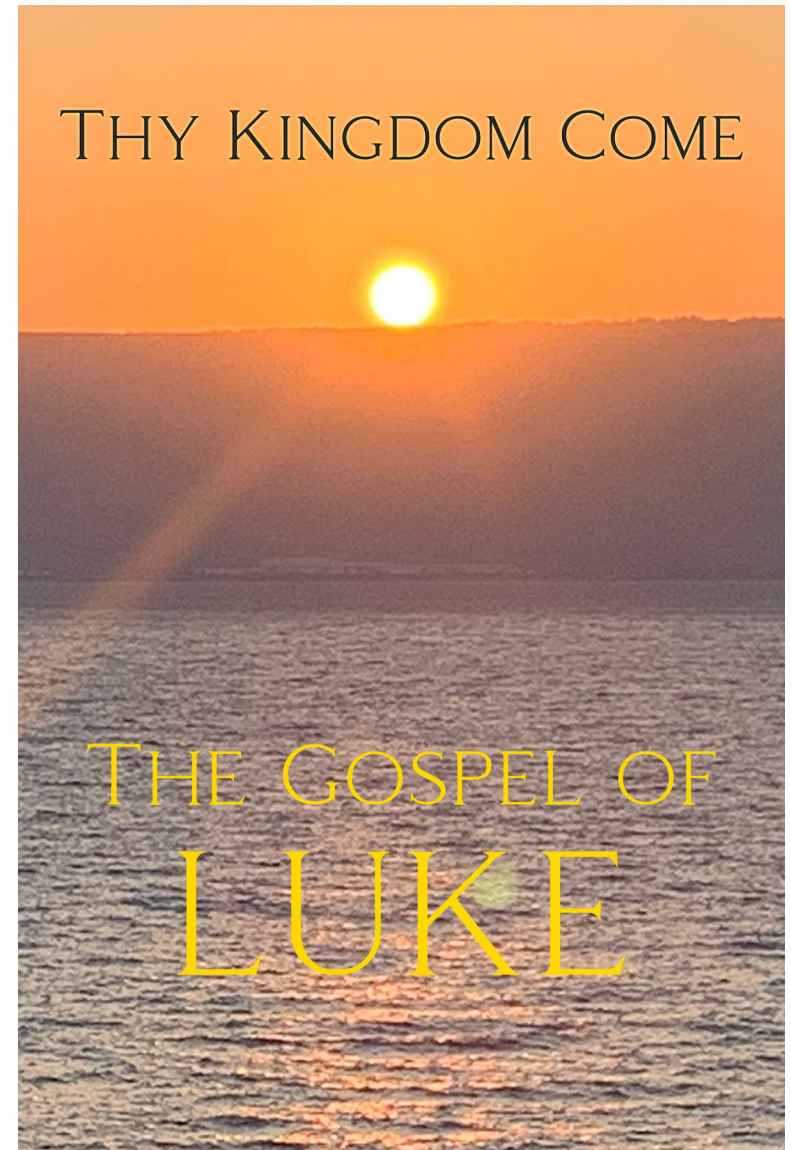

Scripture Reference: Luke 6:47-49 (ESV)

Luke 6:47. Everyone who comes to me and hears my words and does them, I will show you what he is like:

Luke 6:48. he is like a man building a house, who dug deep and laid the foundation on the rock. And when a flood arose, the stream broke against that house and could not shake it, because it had been well built.

Luke 6:49. But the one who hears and does not do them is like a man who built a house on the ground without a foundation. When the stream broke against it, immediately it fell, and the ruin of that house was great."

Synopsis: Becoming Petrified Christians

Jesus concludes His epic Sermon on the Mount with a familiar parable about two builders-- one wise and one foolish. The wise builder digs deep to ground his house on solid rock while the foolish builder trusts the loose topsoil. When a storm comes the house with no foundation is swept away and the other withstands the torrent. Jesus of course is using an analogy to teach how important it is for our Christian faith and the churches we attend to be firmly grounded and indeed built upon the Word of God. After analyzing the parable, we will dig deeper to determine what Jesus means by a "firm foundation" and the only place it can currently be found. Ultimately we will speak of the process whereby to begin to assimilate the rock-solid foundation of the Words of Christ, and little by little become "petrified" Christians!
