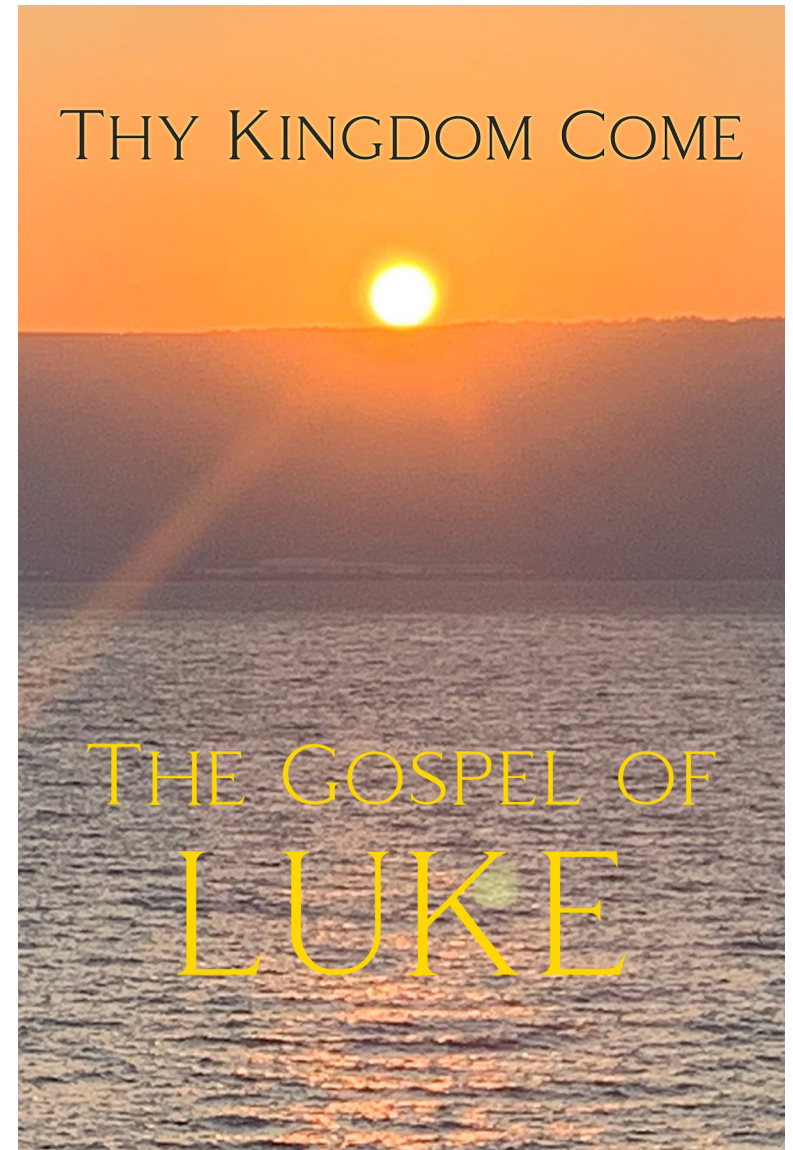

## Scripture Reference: Luke 9:12-17 (ESV)

Luke 9:12. Now the day began to wear away, and the twelve came and said to him, "Send the crowd away to go into the surrounding villages and countryside to find lodging and get provisions, for we are here in a desolate place."

Luke 9:13. But he said to them, "You give them something to eat." They said, "We have no more than five loaves and two fish--unless we are to go and buy food for all these people."

Luke 9:14. For there were about five thousand men. And he said to his disciples, "Have them sit down in groups of about fifty each."

Luke 9:15. And they did so, and had them all sit down.

Luke 9:16. And taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven and said a blessing over them. Then he broke the loaves and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd.

Luke 9:17. And they all ate and were satisfied. And what was left over was picked up, twelve baskets of broken pieces.

### Synopsis: "The Apostling Dynamic"

In one of the best known miracles in the Gospels, Jesus supernaturally multiplies five loaves of bread and two fish to feed five-thousand men, (not including women and children). After establishing the importance of accepting this story for what it is: an historical, supernatural miracle; we will then view the event in a more figurative sense-- as a "living parable" that reveals the important relationship between Jesus and His apostles. Jesus is the miracle-working supernatural Son of God, who alone can transform the heart. But the apostles (or as we will refer to them-- the "apostlers") are commissioned to distribute that Bread to the masses in an orderly way. Once again, we see the Kingdom Strategy of evangelism clearly illustrated for us. After drawing profound lessons from the text concerning the nature of this work, we will turn our attention to the nature of Christ and the centrality of proclaiming the "de-naturalized" Jesus as the core element of the "apostling dynamic".
