

Scripture Reference: Luke 11:37-44 (ESV)

Luke 11:37. While Jesus was speaking, a Pharisee asked him to dine with him, so he went in and reclined at table.

Luke 11:38. The Pharisee was astonished to see that he did not first wash before dinner.

Luke 11:39. And the Lord said to him, "Now you Pharisees cleanse the outside of the cup and of the dish, but inside you are full of greed and wickedness.

Luke 11:43. Woe to you Pharisees! For you love the best seat in the synagogues and greetings in the marketplaces.

Luke 11:44. Woe to you! For you are like unmarked graves, and people walk over them without knowing it."

Synopsis: "Avoiding Unmarked Graves"

After a deep Theological discussion of spiritual Light and darkness, Jesus turns His attention to the ultimate example of spiritual depravity— the religious hypocrite. Focusing on the Pharisees of His day, He methodically begins to unmask the wretched state of the inner darkness of their souls and contrast it sharply with their outward pretension of religious piety. We will pay careful attention to each of Jesus' examples of their deceptive nature, including the first three of six "woes" directed specifically at the Pharisees. Ultimately we will identify important principles from the text that will help us unmask religious hypocrisy in all ages, and thereby (to use one of Jesus' woes) avoid the unmarked graves!
