Synopsis: "The (Good) News You Need to Know"

In our hyper-connected world with 24-hour news coming at us it can be difficult to discard what is unimportant and pay attention to what is important. Paul was a one-message newscaster. And from every piece of news offered to you every second, this is the one message that needs to be always in the front, for your meditation. The Good News you need to hear for your salvation.

Moment in the Word: Rom. 3:21-26

Rom. 3:21. But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it—

Rom. 3:22. the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction:

Rom. 3:23. for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,

Rom. 3:24. and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus,

Rom. 3:25. whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins.

Rom. 3:26. It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.
