

Scripture Reference: Luke 23:13-16 (ESV)

Luke 23:13. Pilate then called together the chief priests and the rulers and the people,

Luke 23:14. and said to them, "You brought me this man as one who was misleading the people. And after examining him before you, behold, I did not find this man guilty of any of your charges against him.

Luke 23:15. Neither did Herod, for he sent him back to us. Look, nothing deserving death has been done by him.

Luke 23:16. I will therefore punish and release him."

Synopsis: "Our Only Hope In Life And In Death"

After being interrogated, rejected and eventually mocked by Herod, Jesus is dressed in a shiny robe and returned to Pilate. Pilate calls the Jews together and declares once again that he finds no fault in Jesus-- especially not a crime worthy of death. But rather than releasing Jesus as He should have done, this weak leader proposed a compromise-- he will punish Jesus and release Him. After working our way through this transitional text, we will consider the fact, on this Advent Sunday of hope, that four different people or groups are presented in this passage in which we can place our hope: the "world" and its pleasures as represented by Herod; governments and institutions of man as represented by Pilate; formal religions and religiosity as represented by the chief priests-- and ultimately Jesus. When considering the nature and degree of "hope" that can be found in each of these four entities, we will turn to Scripture to find our answers. Ultimately, we will agree with the Heidelberg Catechism which, proclaims: "Our only hope in life and in death is our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!"

Advent Responsive Reading: Hope

[Pastor:] 700 Years before Jesus was born, the prophet Isaiah mourned over the darkness that gripped the hearts of men...

[Congregation:] Behold, the LORD's hand is not shortened, that it cannot save, or his ear dull, that it cannot hear;

[Pastor:] but your iniquities have made a separation between you and your God, and your sins have hidden his face from you so that he does not hear.

[Congregation:] Therefore justice is far from us, and righteousness does not overtake us; we hope for light, and behold, darkness, and for brightness, but we walk in gloom.

[Pastor:] We grope for the wall like the blind; we grope like those who have no eyes; we stumble at noon as in the twilight, among those in full vigor we are like dead men.

[Congregation:] We all growl like bears; we moan and moan like doves; we hope for justice, but there is none; for salvation, but it is far from us.

[Pastor:] But God also revealed to Isaiah that a Savior was coming to give the people hope...
