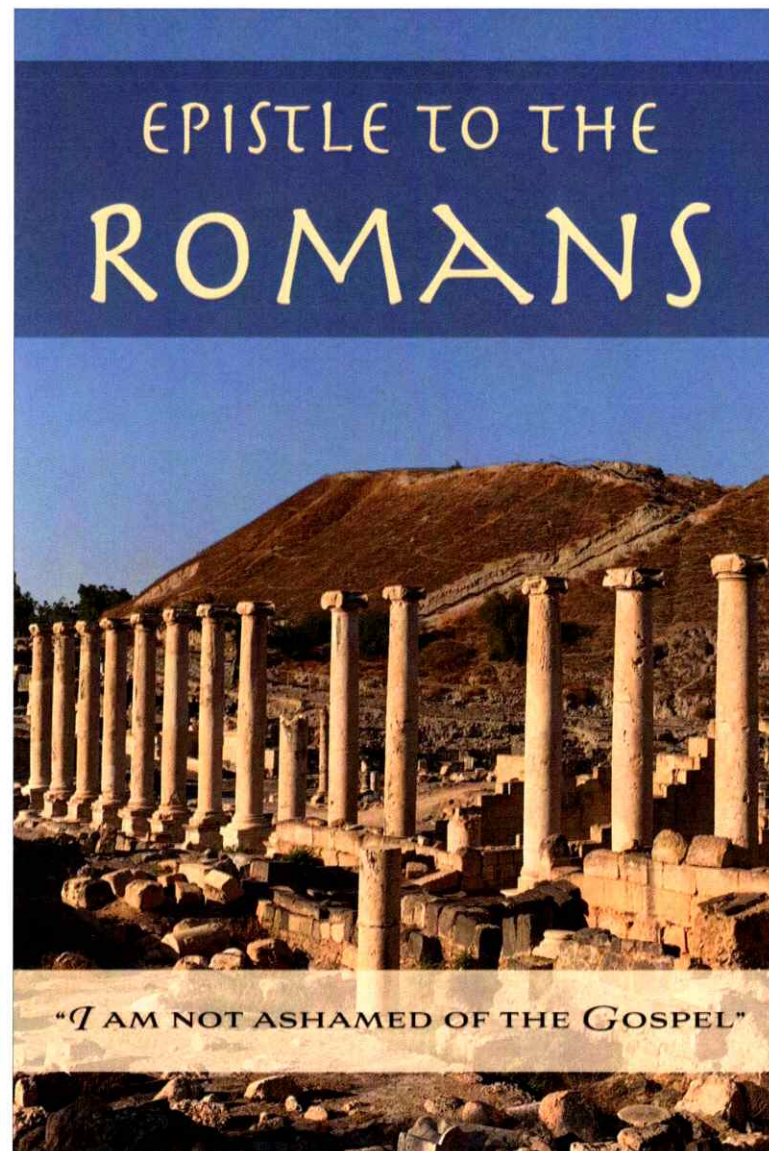

We will notice the awesome power that is manifest by the Resurrection of Christ and how He rules His Kingdom from that position of power even now. We will continue to approach this glorious journey from the Triune God's point of view as we unpack and delight in Paul's clear but compressed rendition of the Gospel. Ultimately we will celebrate God's amazing plan of Redemption and realize that such a salvation demands "our soul, our life, our all"!
